

Weekly Status Report

VILLAGE MANAGER'S MESSAGE (6/14/2024)

Today we celebrate Flag Day to honor the day in 1777 when the Continental Congress passed a resolution adopting the flag of the United States of America. A year earlier on July 4th the same body approved the language of the Declaration of Independence, and some may have signed it (most signed on August 2nd). This year we will celebrate July 4th in Villa Park.

Planning and Zoning considered an application last night to grant a Special Use Permit for an additional cannabis dispensary on North Avenue and it received a 6-1 positive recommendation. The Village received about \$200,000 in revenues from the assessment of a 3% Municipal Cannabis Retailers' Occupation Tax in 2022 and 2023. Those funds are divided in three equal portions to the police pension fund, the fire pension fund and to fund Parks and in particular to the Recreation Center.

I met with the Police leadership and Cecilia Diaz and Levi Thompson from the Federal Railroad Administration. They came to put their eyes on our train station. They were in town to work with communities to reduce trespasses on train tracks, particularly those that result in fatalities. It was a good discussion, and they were encouraging about our efforts to get a grade separation project (underpass/overpass).

I was out of town last week and so I missed the paving of the majority of the Tri-Trail Connector. There are still some details to complete but we hope to have an official ribbon cutting event in July. This connector will allow bicyclists and pedestrians to have an asphalt pathway with the width needed for safe travel physically separated from motorized traffic except at intersections. It also creates a route for a 5-kilometer race/walk that would be completely on dedicated pathways.

We held our first meeting concerning the budget this week. We reviewed what worked and what needed to be improved this year. Most importantly we set a schedule early enough in the year to get the entire process started in a timely fashion and avoid errors and delays that were caused last year. Unfortunately, we will not have the new BS&A software installed in time to conduct this year's budget development in the new software.

Today staff attended the first "All-Hands" meeting since I have been here. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss issues affecting the entire organization. I reviewed the new initiatives in the Village, especially the Strategic Plan update and as part of that effort the adoption of Organizational Values. Having held two of the three meetings so far, I can say that it has been well received.

Public Works Highlights

- Public Works staff completed and published the village's Annual Drinking Water Quality Report this week. The report can be viewed at:

- Excavation in preparation for topsoil placement as a part of the Tri-Trail Connector Project was completed this week. Placement of topsoil and sod is tentatively expected to begin in the next one to two weeks, weather permitting.
- A construction contract for the Iowa and Vermont Improvement Project was awarded this week. Staff is working to execute the contract. A pre-construction meeting is scheduled for next week.
- Public Works staff attended the Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan 2024 Annual Update Meeting held by DuPage County.
- Engineering staff met with a consultant this week to review the scope of Phase I engineering services for future STP-funded street improvements on multiple segments of Ardmore Avenue.
- Engineering staff met with Community and Economic Development staff this week to review proposed private developments.
- Second interviews for the open Maintenance Worker I full-time position are ongoing.

Public Infrastructure Projects

College Streets This large project has been placed on hold due to budget concerns. It was decided to separate North Wisconsin Avenue from the College Streets Project and complete that street as a separate project, as it does not include water main replacement. In addition, the village has been awarded CDBG grant funding for the construction of two smaller portions of the larger project.

Iowa & Vermont A construction contract for this project was awarded this week. Staff is working to execute the contract. A pre-construction meeting is scheduled for next week. This project consists of water main replacement on West Vermont from Iowa to Wisconsin; and water main replacement and street improvements on North Iowa from Vermont to Plymouth.

Jackson Pond Staff is in the process of reviewing final engineering plans for this Jackson Area Improvement portion of the project. This last phase of the larger Jackson Pond Project includes construction of new relief storm sewer mains on portions of Madison Street, Wisconsin Avenue, and Addison Avenue, and includes extensions of the proposed storm sewers onto private properties in several locations. The project will be advertised for bidding when the design is complete. Bidding is currently expected to take place in the next months. Staff is also working to coordinate the required spring maintenance of the native plantings in the expanded Jackson Pond.

Tri-Trail Excavation in preparation for topsoil placement was completed this week. Placement of topsoil and sod is tentatively expected to begin in the next one to two weeks, weather permitting.
